

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
Attendance

Many of you will be aware that one of the Government's priorities is to improve student attendance rates nationwide. All schools are required to implement the Stepped Attendance Response (STAR) to track attendance from the start of the year. Our goal is to have 80% of students attend regularly, that is to attend school more than 90% of the time.



In Term 4, 2024 we were close to reaching this target, with 73% of students attending regularly. This is pleasing but there is clearly room for improvement. We also have some work to do around arriving at school on time. We will be tracking our progress closely throughout the year and connecting with whānau that may require support in improving attendance.

Rob Cope Cyber Safety

Thank you to everyone who attended our Cyber Safety Parent Evening with Rob Cope last night - we had close to 120 attend! It was confronting, entertaining, but most of all, informative. I hope it provided you with an opportunity to reflect on the impact of screen time in all our lives. It is an incredibly complex world to navigate, but the key message for me as a parent was the importance of taking control, taking the lead in your child's screen consumption, and setting consistent boundaries. Rob has provided you with many useful tools, which are free for you to access. He will also be providing us with resources for the senior classrooms, along with regular tips we can share with you to support your efforts at home.

My other suggestion for those who attended last night, make sure to spread the word to others in the community so we can perhaps have a shared approach to tackling this.

For parents who couldn't attend Rob's in-person session, the video version of his talk is included in the Informed and Empowered programme. Many schools have seen over 90% parent participation by offering sessions at different times (e.g., 3 PM and 6 PM over a couple of evenings).


