
If you've visited school, you'll see quite a bit of property work has happened over the summer break, including some on-going work.

As many of you know, life at Muritai is always busy with loads of exciting things happening on a weekly basis. It is essential to keep on top of communications using our app and our school calendar so you are aware of what is happening when!

Below are the key tools for you as parents/caregivers at home:

- **The Muritai Beacon:** This newsletter will be distributed fortnightly on a Friday afternoon. As we are an Enviro-School we distribute this via the parent app. We are happy to include community messages in the newsletter. We would appreciate it if all messages could be shared with the school office by the Wednesday afternoon before the Beacon is distributed.
- Weekly Heads-up: On Friday afternoons every week you'll receive a short email bullet pointing important 'need to know' from across the school. This is a great way to keep up to date with the next week's activities.
- The @School App Parent App. We have been using this app for two years now to share all our key information with you at home. This includes our communications (teacher messages, newsletters, notices) distributing student reports on your child and celebrating the learning via the blog function. There are also useful links to the school facebook page and calendar. You will be lost without this tool so it's essential to have it up and running. We also recommend allowing notifications on this app so you get alerted when new information is available.
- **Email:** This is usually only used when we are connecting with you 1:1 rather than on mass with the class, syndicate or school.
- School Website & Calendar: On the 'Noticeboard' tab of our website: <u>https://www.muritai.school.nz/calendar</u> there is a Community Calendar, which we will be continuing to utilise in 2025. All important dates for families will be included on this calendar, so it is useful to visit this regularly to keep up to date with the latest events. Events are also shown at the end of the newsletter.
- **Facebook:** Have you 'liked' our School Facebook page? We utilise this page for reminders, but more importantly, to celebrate the wonderful things that happen at Muritai School. Just search Muritai School on Facebook to find our page.
- **Google Forms:** We will continue to use Google Forms for permission and newsletters that require responses from parents. If you ever need assistance with completing these, please contact the office.

Teacher Only Day: April 11th - Last Day of Term 1

In 2025, schools across the country are starting to implement two new curriculums - Literacy and Numeracy. This is a huge undertaking for teachers which requires time to understand new learning progressions, resources and assessments. The Ministry of Education has allocated 2 teacher only days for schools to support this initiative. Our cluster of schools in Lower Hutt have been awarded free professional development by the Ministry with the first PD day scheduled for **the last day of Term 1 - April 11th.** This means the last day of the term for students will be **Thursday April 10th.** Please make alternative arrangements for your child on Friday 11 April.

Finally, the beginning of the school year can be an adjustment for many students. To help them settle in, we encourage **early bedtimes** to ensure they are well-rested and ready for learning. **Plenty of water and food in school bags** to keep energy levels up throughout the day.
