Wow, it is hard to believe we are nearly at the end of Term 1! It has certainly flown by!


An important reminder that the last day of the term for students is Thursday 10th April as school is closed for **Teacher Only Day on Friday 11th April.** This is a dedicated professional development day, allocated by the Ministry of Education for unpacking the new Maths Curriculum. Our teachers will be working off site, at Hutt Central School, working with other teachers from across the Lower Hutt cluster of schools.

As you are aware, our Associate Principal Jamie Power will be leaving Muritai at the end of this term to take on the Deputy Principal role at Raumati South School. I am pleased to announce that we have a wonderful teacher for our Room 13 learners. Mary Heath will be joining the Tūī team from the beginning of Term 2 through to the end of the year. Mary has relocated from Auckland, where she previously taught at St Mary's Northcote. She possesses strong literacy and numeracy knowledge and has a calm, inclusive approach to her teaching. She also knows Muritai and Eastbourne well, as she was a previous student at Muritai and is Gabrielle Heath's daughter!

At the end of next week you'll be receiving your child's Goal Setting summary via the Caregiver App. Keep a look out for this next Thursday. These goals have been set by the teacher and student, using assessment information that has been gathered over the first term of school. Please take the time to read these goals and discuss them with your child at home. Early in Term 2, we will be hosting Learning Conversations meetings with you. This will be an opportunity to discuss the learning goals more and share progress in your child's learning over the first term at school. Throughout term 2 you will receive updates on your child's learning via the Caregiver App, giving you a snapshot of some of the learning they have been doing at school.

A reminder that these learning updates and additional Learning Conversations replace the mid year written report at the end of Term 2.

James shared more information about how we plan to prepare the soil, ready for more planting in this area. As reported earlier, James has built collection bins by the orchard for community donations of organic material, including:

- Cardboard, newspaper
- Compost, worm castings
- Leaf mulch, grass clippings, straw or hay, comfrey, seaweed
- Pea straw, wood chips, shredded paper or cardboard
- Coffee grounds, eggshells, wood ash (untreated)

Please ensure all materials are bagged and tightly secured. We also welcome donations of vegetable plants, fruit trees, grape vines, berry canes, native

trees and shrubs, or bee-friendly perennials. It is exciting to see this initiative take shape!


